

Angat Dam water supply enough amid consumption increase since enhanced quarantine —NWRB

The National Water Resources Board (NWRB) on Tuesday said water supply from Angat Dam is enough despite the increase in consumption amid the enhanced community quarantine in Luzon.

NWRB executive director Seville David Jr. said the water level in Angat Dam was recorded at 192.95 meters on Tuesday, higher than its minimum operating level at 180 meters.

“Masasabi po natin sa ganitong lebel ay medyo komportable pa ang lebel ng Angat Dam para punan ang pangangailangan natin partikular sa panahon ng COVID dito sa Metro Manila,” he said in an interview on Doble B sa News TV.

“Gusto nating pabulaanan 'yung mga lumalabas na balita sa socila media na kinukulang tayo sa tubig. May sapat pa po tayong tubig partikular ngayong summer at hanggang sa susunod na buwan po,” he added.

David said they expect the rainy season to start on time this year unlike in 2019 when the Philippines was affected by the El Niño.

The NWRB [increased the Metropolitan Waterworks and Sewerage System's water allocation from Angat Dam](#) to 46 cubic meters per second (CMS) from the reduced 42 CMS amid the threat of COVID-19. —**Joviland Rita/KG, GMA News**
